

President's Report Mr Andrew Norton - President

2023 has been an incredible year for your Chamber. I want to start by thanking our Sponsors, Members, Directors, and the office team who made 2023 the success it was.

It has been a privilege and honor to lead the Chamber over 2023 and 2024 and, with the teamwork of a talented, diverse, and passionate Board of Directors, I'm proud of what we have achieved and the foundation we have set for the future. The Directors and office team this year have delivered amazing value for members this year.

Our number of members has been higher every single month this year compared to the same month last year. Your Chamber continues to grow. We finished the year with 417 members – our highest number of members in 10 years. We also finished the year with a very strong cash position despite making a significant investment in a new office for the Chamber during the year. Finally, we have a professional and spacious facility in a world-class commercial tower operated by one of our members. As members of the Chamber, you are welcome to visit the office and can use the facilities of the office and the incredible tenant facilities in the building.

I want to thank both Frank Holzer and Matt Cutt for their financial stewardship of the Chamber over the last 12 months. Their countless hours and thoughtful leadership have put your Chamber in a very strong and sustainable position.

I also take great pleasure in thanking Her Excellency Dr. Angela Macdonald, the Australian Ambassador to Thailand, her team at the Embassy, and the Austrade team, for their support of the Australian business community. The relationship between AustCham and the embassy has a long history, and we are grateful for the numerous opportunities to collaborate for the benefit of our members and sponsors.

During the year our sponsors and members had a chance to meet in person with Mr. Nicholas Moore in his capacity as the Australian government Special Envoy for Southeast Asia. The Australian Government's strategy was released mid-2023.AustCham Thailand had



significant opportunities to input into this report and we were grateful to host Mr. Moore at our end of year Sundowners last year to discuss the findings and actions.

The sub-committees of the Chamber are established to encourage our members to engage in the organization of events with our directors for specific industries. At the start of this year, we said our strategy was to make the Chamber more relevant to more members with more events. I am proud to say we have made big progress on that strategy.

Firstly, 2023/24 has been a record year for events for the Chamber. Compared to the year prior we had over 25% more events for our members. We have also had more free events for members than ever before. More events and more free events create more value for you, our members, and our sponsors.

I want to draw to your attention two new areas of development and one area of continued growth and impact for AustCham this year.

First, our SME sub-committee, led by Matt Cutt, is booming. Our monthly, free, SME coffee mornings have become so well attended we have had to move the venue twice to bigger and better venues. SMEs are the core of our AustCham community and I'm so proud of the work Matt and his committee have done building a vibrant and engaged community and providing them with monthly free seminars to help them grow their business.





Secondly, I want to celebrate the establishment of our Next Gen community led by Joana Button. The launch event was spectacular with 130 people attending – for many it was their first AustCham event. The follow up event also had over 100 people. I can now see a community of leaders young and young at heart networking, supporting one another, and getting more involved in our Chamber. Thank you to Joana for her passion and relentless energy in leading this. Finally, not a new area, but one that continues to grow and make a positive difference, is our CSR Program.

I had the honor of recognizing Saj Iqbal with the President's award for 2023. Saj has made an incredible contribution to Thailand over many years, and I've had the pleasure of serving on the Board with him for the last 4 years. In addition to being a brilliant thought leader as Vice President, Saj is perhaps best known for the CSR Programs he has spearheaded



on behalf of our members and sponsors. AustCham Thailand has a hugely impactful CSR Program that has made a meaningful difference to thousands of people's lives through numerous initiatives including the COVID Care package and this year our Boxing Kangaroo CARE Package, which exceeded all expectations and raised over 1 million THB and supported 15 orphanages around Thailand and over 2,000 orphaned children. In 2023 we raised in total 2.6 million THB. As well as orphanages we have supported 12 charities in Thailand. This is the highest number of charities supported in a given year. Saj's leadership of one of the largest Australian owned companies in Thailand plus his leadership in the Chamber and the CSR subcommittee made him a most worthy recipient of the President's award.

I would like to thank my fellow AustCham Directors – you have truly been an exceptional Board with great teamwork and support. I also want to thank all our members who volunteer time on our sub-committees to bring great content and events to other members week after week.

In total we organized 69 AustCham led events and partnered with fellow Chambers in another 11.

You are a remarkable team and I know our members and Board appreciate all you do.

Looking ahead we have incredible momentum as we start 2024 with many more events coming up. There are so many ways you can engage and be a part of the AustCham community.

A brief comment that I have decided to step down from the Board after 4 years' service to the Chamber. My work and travel commitments over 2024 are now such that I'm spending much more time outside of Thailand. It isn't possible to do justice to the time commitments required of a Board member. I've loved my time on the Board, and I want to thank our members for giving me that opportunity and thank the Board I've had the pleasure of working with over the last 12 months. You have been an exceptional group of people to work with.

Thank you all again for your ongoing support and my best wishes to the incoming President and Board Members to be installed at the March Annual General Meeting.

I am confident that 2024 will be another successful year of high achievements, connections, and memorable moments for us all. AustCham continues to be one of the most successful, strongest, and well-regarded Chambers. I have no doubt the Board will continue to strengthen your Chamber in 2024 and beyond.

Treasurer's Report Matthew Cutt - Treasurer

It is a privilege to present to the members my first report as Treasurer. I would like to start by thanking Frank Holzer for his support during this handover year. Some great contributors will rotate off the Board this year,


including Frank and I would like to officially recognize the contribution that they have made to our Chamber.

2023 has been a year of change, records and positioning with a new President in Andrew and a new Executive Director with Sam taking on the role earlier in the year. We have provided a record number of events to our members, raised record amounts as part of the Chamber's CSR programs and invested in new offices (that members can use) which position the Chamber for growth. It has been a good feeling to be part of a chamber that is making an impact in our community.

The Chamber made a small deficit of THB 41,311 which, when adjusted for non-cash related expenditure, means the chamber was operational cash flow positive over the twelve-month period. As a not-for-profit this means we steadied the overall position of the Chamber.



The year finished with a small increase in membership numbers, which is a credit to the Austcham Team and the Members in their ongoing support. This increase in numbers directly contributed to an increase in membership revenue as presented further in this report.




Membership fees have only had one small increase since 2013 reflecting the Board's commitment to giving members the best value possible. This year we will continue to hold membership fees flat with no increase. The outcome of this strategy is reflected in our ability to maintain a consistent Membership Base. The Board are currently reviewing member pricing specifically in relation to creating more membership categories which may promote a broader more diverse membership base.

Event income was broadly in line with the prior year (both at income and expense level) as Austcham continues to be known as the premier networking event in Bangkok held monthly. Event prices were not adjusted despite increased costs and as it becomes ever more competitive to secure venues as hotels bounced out of Covid. The Chamber continued to invest in a broader range of events as well as those outside of Bangkok. The results of these offset some of the profitability of the Bangkok sundowners. Some of these events will hopefully transpire in to increased membership engagement as they become a more regular part of the annual calendar. This is currently under Board review.


The graph below shows the performance of the monthly Bangkok sundowners highlighting the overall growth in numbers.



Sponsorship continues to be a challenge and an area of increased focus for the Chamber. We are currently revisiting the packages to provide a more tailored solution as each sponsor tends to value different aspects of the Chambers activities. We really do thank those who continue to support us in various levels of sponsorship.

On the cost side, salaries and benefits were slightly up on prior year with the transition of a new CEO and recognizing the efforts the AustCham office played during the transaction phase. Rental costs have increased given the investment in the new office space which is an investment for the future of the Chamber.

On the balance sheet the Chamber continues to be in a solid position with strong cash reserves as noted below. It should be highlighted, however, that THB 1.8m of the funds below relate to CSR funds raised. This will be paid to the CSR charities which are supported by the Chamber. This money was donated following the year-end further encouraging the chamber to continue with its CSR activities.





In conclusion as Treasurer

The year of 2023 was a successful yes financially stable year with the launch of a number of new initiatives and the solid performance member numbers and the Bangkok sundowners which is a credit to the Board, the AustCham team and the members for the commitment and support in 2023.

I believe that this Treasurer's Report and associated audited financial statements that follow truly reflect the financial position of the Australian-Thai Chamber of Commerce as of 31 December 2023.




